CCTFT JOINS ENERGY EXPERTS, POLICYMAKERS FOR LBJ SCHOOL ENERGY SYMPOSIUM

AUSTIN, Texas (March 10, 2009) — The Clean Coal Technology Foundation of Texas is proud to participate in the “Steps Toward a Sustainable Austin Energy” symposium, sponsored by the LBJ School of Public Affairs March 10. The symposium concludes a year of research by 25 University of Texas graduate students, given the task to determine whether Austin Energy can reach carbon neutrality by 2020.

Foundation Executive Director Jay Dauenhauer will represent CCTFT in the opening panel, “Austin Energy’s Coal, Gas and Nuclear Future,” beginning at 1:30 p.m.

“We support a balanced portfolio for energy providers,” said Dauenhauer. “Everything needs to be on the table, including clean coal technology. We have a great story to tell with coal, and this is going to be an exciting venue to share that story.”

Austin Energy currently gets 32% of its power from the Fayette Power Project, an award-winning facility owned by Foundation member LCRA.

The symposium will be held at the Eidman Courtroom at the University of Texas at Austin School of Law. The event will begin with a portfolio analysis simulator exhibition from 9:00-11:00 a.m., followed by panel discussions from 1:15-6:00 p.m. The symposium will conclude with a public forum beginning at 6:30 p.m.
